Journey Support Group - New Venue - Pulborough Library




Events & Meetings



Modern Board Games Club

We were thrilled to welcome attendees to the second session of our club, currently centred around the Dungeons & Dragons role-playing game. Just like last week, we were oversubscribed, with 16 enthusiastic young people eager to participate. Fortunately, our Dungeon Master (DM), Oscar, anticipated the demand and brought a friend to co-DM. This allowed us to split the group into two sessions—one continuing the previous game and the other setting up characters and game sheets for newcomers.

The new players quickly got into the swing of things, and it was wonderful to hear their creativity come to life as the games unfolded. One player even messaged his mum midway through to share how much fun he was having and that he couldn't wait for the next session.

It's safe to say this club has been an unexpected success. A conversation with one parent, who also works in a local school, highlighted just how needed it is—she mentioned that while the district offers over 300 sporting activities for young people, non-sporting options are scarce.

Although we didn't have exact figures when we started, we were well aware of the lack of diverse youth activities in the area. This is exactly why we set up this club—to create a space where young people can connect, imagine, and explore new worlds together.

Youth Forum



We have been exploring the idea of a Youth Forum for some time now, and while it hasn't yet been launched, the concept is to create a platform where young community members can voice their opinions and influence decisions that impact them both now and in the future.

Two years ago, I engaged with a group of young people to gather their input. After setting aside some of the more whimsical suggestions like a 'cloud machine' and a popcorn dispenser, one practical request stood out: the installation of a trampoline in the playground at the main recreation ground.

Following discussions with the Parish Council, we are optimistic that this project will come to fruition. The Council has identified a small budget for this initiative and has already obtained quotes. Stay tuned for further updates!



Wallet Theft from the Village Stores

A community member asked for my help after his wallet was stolen. He had accidentally left it behind in the Village Stores, where someone found it and took it without returning it to him or the shop. This situation is known as 'Theft by Finding.

Liaising with Sussex Police we viewed the CCTV but were unfortunately not able to identify the suspect.

Investigations into the identity of the individual are ongoing.

Fly Tipping

Unfortunately, we have seen a dreadful amount of domestic rubbish dumped in our lovely rural lanes this month including what appears to be a large amount of kitchen cabinets and equipment.

We do keep a keen eye on the area as part of our regular patrols and either report this ourselves or help people to report it to our colleagues in HDC using the links below. HDC will attempt to clear fly tipping the same day if possible.



- Provide a highly visible and reassuring uniformed patrolling presence.
- Provide an effective eyes and ears service aimed at reducing the fear of crime and improving quality of life.
