### Community engagement/events/meetings

We ran another multi sports session, this was the last one before Christmas break. The uptake from families in Ashington has increased and they are proving very well received from parents and children alike.

We held our last journey session of the year. From the feedback from parents and carers they are keen for these to continue. Since these began we have seen firsthand how well this safe space has been received by parents and carers. From people attending in tears because things are overwhelming to hearing the successes of challenges that

parents are overcoming. They provide great support locally and the parents advise, support and encourage each other in these sessions. We look forward to continuing these after Christmas.

#### Patrols (foot/visible and car)

We have patrolled the whole parish on foot and in the vehicle this month focusing on areas brought to our attention.

### Older, vulnerable people and youth

We worked with the Storehouse this month on delivering food hampers to people in need. This was greatly received, and such effort put into the contents.

We have been doing welfare checks on vulnerable residents on the run up to Christmas to check they have all the correct support in place over the festive period.

We have been working closely with a vulnerable person in the village who is struggling with their mobility and mental health. We are doing what we can to support this resident, as well as submitting referrals and forms as necessary, as well as other agencies we will continue to work closely.

We had a meeting with Age UK regarding projects in Ashington. Following on from the success of Cuppa and Chat at the Red Lion which we set up together. We are in conversations about future plans and what the need is in the village.

We have attended youth club on different sessions this month to engage with the young people as well as the youth team.

#### Dog related issues

We have been in contact with Bone Canis about running another dog behaviour session on the recreation ground. We didn't have the best weather last time albeit people still attended. It will give owners a chance to discuss any behaviour issues regarding their dogs and be given free advice on how to combat these issues.
