Anti-Social Behaviour

Through our partnership working, in particular with Sussex Police and Neighbourhood Watch Association, plus routine monitoring of crime reporting websites for information about suspicious activity, people and vehicles we are able to understand and respond to emerging trends.

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to an individual, to their community or to their environment. This could be an action by someone else that leaves you feeling alarmed, harassed or distressed. It also includes fear of crime or concern for public safety, public disorder or public nuisance.

08/06 – We spoke to a group of intoxicated adults in Lintot Square asking them to be more considerate of others.

12/06 – A group of young adults stole alcohol from a local retailer.

13/06 – We received a report of broken glass on a slide in a children's play area together with packaging from alcoholic drinks. We liaised with the Parish Council and The Ghyll so that the area could be cleared and made safe again.

18/06 – We carried out a home visit to a resident who contacted us in relation to anti-social behaviour from one of their neighbours.

25/06 – We carried out a joint visit with PCSO Cecil relating to a resident reporting further anti-social behaviour from one of their neighbours.

Parking/vehicles

We conduct regular parking patrols at key times around our schools and in general there has been an improvement in the parking behaviour but there remains a constant small number of drivers who require encouragement to park appropriately.

Following a request from a parent, we operated patrols at 0800 hours on several mornings to provide a visible presence at the bus stop outside the Tipsy Fox as it has become increasingly dangerous for our school students to access their bus as it is being forced to pull up in the middle of Worthing Road due to people parking in the bus stop. We would ask that everyone stops using bus stops for parking even if it is only momentarily as this causes unnecessary addition dangers for other people.

05/06/24 – We attended a presentation by Derek Pratt MBE and Rachel Mundy of Sussex Community Search Team at the Welcome Club in the Village Hall.









Sussex Community Search Team is an all-volunteer group of dedicated and enthusiastic people who are ready and willing to be called out by Sussex Police, neighbouring police forces or participants in the Sussex Resilience Forum. During incidents and emergencies, the SRF brings together emergency services, councils, utilities and other essential public and voluntary services to work in partnership to support the local community.

All members of Sussex Community Search Team (SCST) are trained in the latest search techniques, and are on call throughout the year, across all terrains and in all weather conditions.

The trained volunteers live or work across or near Sussex and can usually attend police callouts at short notice. On scene, they work together seamlessly with the police and other search resources to conduct the most effective and efficient search possible.

Patrols

- We continue patrols of local businesses designed to disrupt shoplifting, ASB and improve engagement.
- We continue to provide high visibility patrols both on foot and in a liveried vehicle throughout the Parish.

Older, Vulnerable People and Youth

We routinely conduct high visibility patrols at times and in areas often used by older residents to offer a reassuring presence plus cover areas previously connected with ASB in order to act as a deterrent. Throughout the month, we regularly visited the Southwater Youth Project and engaged with many young people.

11/06/24 - We assisted two vulnerable people to find their lost car keys.

13/06/24 - We made a home visit to support a concerned resident with what she thought was hazardous waste.

14/06/24 - We made a home visit to a vulnerable person to offer advice and reassurance following Scam phone calls.

14/06/24 - We provided a food parcel to a vulnerable resident.

17/06/24 - We carried out a joint visit with PCSO Cecil to check on the welfare of a resident.

22/06/24 - During our patrol, we noticed a front door of a house had been left open. We checked on the resident who we found well and assisted with some technical issues (TV & telephone).

26/06/24 - We carried out a welfare check on a vulnerable person in relation to phone scams received.

Public Enquiries

This month we responded to 19 enquiries from residents by phone, email or in person and where necessary, signposted them to the most appropriate support services. These enquires included concerns about scam phone calls, unidentified leaking waste on their property and broken glass in a play area.

Hazards

04/06/24 – We received a report of oil on the road & down a drain outside Castlewood School which we reported to WSCC who dealt with the incident.





05/06/24 – Whilst at the Village Hall, a resident made us aware of overgrown vegetation which is obstructing the view for road users at the junction of New Road & Worthing Road in Horsham. We reported their concerns to WSCC.

12/06/24 – We have received reports of cars causing obstructions of the bus stops by Budgens and the Tipsy Fox on the Worthing Road preventing busses to safely pull into the laybys. This has had an impact on those trying to safely board the busses but also causing congestion on the main road. Regular patrols of this area are being carried out and action taken. West Sussex County Council and Horsham District Council have been made aware.

13/06/24 – We liaised with SPC and The Ghyll to remove broken glass and other litter from the play area.

17/06/24 – We came across an incapacitated pigeon with vehicles trying to avoid it. We rescued the animal from the road and within a short period of time the pigeon recovered and was able to safely fly away.

19/06/24 – During our patrol, we came across a vintage car that had run out of petrol. We assisted by moving the vehicle to a safe place whilst petrol was being organised.

22/06/24 – We were called to an incident involving a van colliding with a residential building directly above the parking area. The damage was reported to Horsham District Council as well as the Managing Agents.

28/06/24 – We came across a large vehicle blocking Station Road with other vehicles unable to move. We put a road closure in place and directed traffic until Police could assist.







28/06/24 – we came across an insecure vehicle with the driver's door fully open. We reported this to PCSO Cecil who managed to get hold of the owner so that they could secure their vehicle.


